ACTS 10:44-48

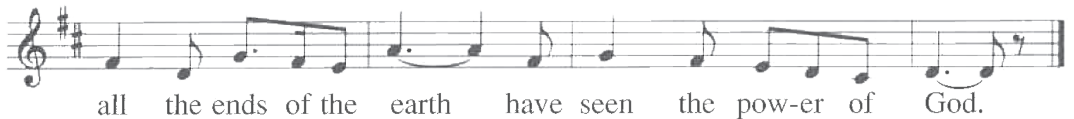

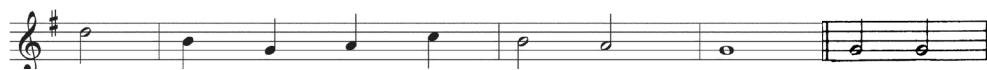

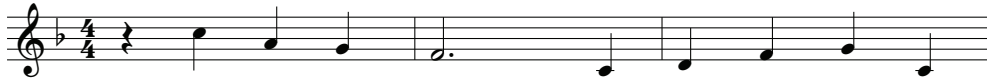
