# FROM THE INTERIM RECTOR

## OUT WITH THE OLD AND IN WITH THE NEW

Dear Friends in Christ,

This week we not only celebrate Thanksgiving and all the gifts that God has given us, but we also begin a new church year. So much has happened this past year. We celebrated our first virtual Christmas, we rang in the New Year with great expectation, and we gave thanks to the scientists and doctors who developed a vaccine to keep us safe and healthy. We continued to watch as our parish hall, and church grounds blossomed with new construction. We welcomed

Bishop Marc to our virtual community. We gathered in our church building for the first time in many months at Pentecost while continuing our live stream and Joyful Noise services online. So much has happened that it is hard to list in such a short space.

I think, most importantly, we remain a people of faith, joining together each Sunday as best we can to celebrate and worship. It has not been easy. Although many of us are vaccinated, some of us thrice, we still worry about our youngest members. Although schools started in-person learning, our children now must readjust to being in the classroom. Parents also must adjust, especially to the chaos caused by students and teachers testing positive to COVID after being together. Throughout all these difficulties, we have stepped up as a community to support each other.

Each Sunday, we take new steps to bring back familiar things while adjusting to our new reality. Our cantors lead us most Sundays and soon have a music director to direct our choir and us. We can process at the beginning and the end of our service, led by acolytes, and opening and closing hymns. We restarted our Community of Wonder with our youth, and we started a confirmation class. Is it church business as usual? Not yet, but we are getting closer to what is normal.

Another blessing is our partnership with the Carey School. Our grounds are filled with the voices of children learning and playing. Their presence is

another sign of moving away from the restrictions caused by the pandemic to a more familiar time, a happier time.

As I reflect on the new church year, I look forward to new beginnings. The Search Committee is renewing its search for a new rector. The staff is planning programs for Advent,

Christmas, and beyond. Our construction continues at a pace, and we look forward to its completion. And we look forward to the day when our children are also protected by vaccination.

## RECTOR SEARCH UPDATE from email sent 11/8/21

I wanted to give you an update on the search process.

The search committee has been working diligently to discern rector candidates to submit to the Vestry. As our interviews and reference checks progressed, we were excited that we had some very talented candidates. Unfortunately, too many of the candidates withdrew from the search process, some quite recently. They left because they, unfortunately, found positions at other churches. After careful review, the search committee agreed we could not forward suitable candidates to the Vestry for further consideration. As a consequence, we decided to re-open the job position to get a new set of candidates.

We reviewed our work with others outside the search committee, and we agreed that our process was sound. We don't need to start from scratch, recreate our approach, write a new parish profile. Denise Obando, the Transition Minister from the Diocese, bluntly characterized it as 'unlucky.'

Advent is quickly approaching, and most candidates will be busy during this season leading up to Christmas (not to mention all of us on the search committee). We will re-open the job posting at the end of November and close the posting mid-January. The search committee will then dive back into the necessary work of the committee. We will complete interviews, select candidates, and present our choices to the Vestry for final decision. We intend to be as efficient, having learned from the last few months.

I know this may be a disappointing message to read; we on the search committee agree. We hoped that we would have exciting candidates to present to the Vestry. However, we feel it's more important to take more time to find the best candidates for Vestry to choose from. We want candidates that will help us take Transfiguration forward. We definitely had choices that we were very excited about; we look forward to finding new and compelling candidates in the next round.

## THE CHRISTMAS TRADITION OF HELP ONE CHILD

Transfiguration has a beautiful tradition of giving gifts that will help the broader community. Last year, we joined with the Church of the Epiphany in making sure that kids in foster homes and group homes receive a present that is just what they want. This year, again in collaboration with Church of the Epiphany, we are helping at least 182 kids in San Mateo County.... And it's really easy to do.



### How it works

• Use the QR code here: (or printed on the ornaments on the Christmas tree in the church sanctuary) and pick a child from the list. You can also find that form here: <https://form.jotform.com/hocgivingtree/Epiphany>.



• Take note of your child's number, name, age, gender and Christmas wish. Most presents will cost less than \$50 but you may opt to spend a few dollars more. If you choose a gift of clothing, try to include a gift receipt in case it needs to be exchanged.

• **Bring the unwrapped gift back** to Transfiguration **on (or before) Sunday, December 12th**. Make sure to include the number and name of your child. (Let us know if that date doesn't work for you and we'll work something out.)

• Merry Christmas!

### Who we are helping

You'll find kids ranging from toddlers through the age of 21. We are also supporting group homes with presents for the whole house. Last year, for example one group home wanted to celebrate holidays and birthdays more. Our family sponsored a snow cone machine and a popcorn maker to ensure party treats were always on hand. My daughter has worked in group homes and knows how much small celebrations mean so she felt strongly about adopting a group home. In my family, choosing our kids of the year is our favorite holiday tradition... I hope that it will become a favorite of yours too.

## Help ne Child

We partner with a Los Altos-based organization called Help One Child. This group partners with church and community organizations to give foster, adoptive and at-risk families support that ranges from education, and a sense of community, to tangible resources.

Right now, there are over 50,000 children in foster care in California. Foster kids are more likely to experience homelessness and to be emancipated from the system without a permanent place to go. One in four end up having a child before they age out of the system.

We can help dedicated social workers and foster parents create consistency, predictability and attachment to caring adults—and it can start with something as small as a Christmas present.
