DUNGEONS & DRAGONS. AT CHURCH?

You've heard that we play Dungeons & Dragons (D&D) at church, and you've probably thought "Wait, what?" I'm as surprised as you are. When I started playing D&D in middle school in the 80's, it certainly wasn't cool then. Some adults feared this thing they didn't know, and thought it was one of the many, many things that would corrupt our impressionable youth (like me). It is a fantasybased setting so it involves stories that included killing, witches, devils and demons, priests casting spells, and a pantheon of gods, so it didn't seem to contribute to a healthy Christian lifestyle.

I think it very much contributes to a healthy lifestyle. I've been playing D&D with the same group of friends for well over 40 years. Our D&D sessions have always been a mix of gaming and socializing. For some of us introverts, it's great to have an activity as a focus for us to come together.

You may ask, "OK, but what exactly is D&D?" When we play D&D, we make a story together. The dungeon master (the DM) defines the world where the story takes place and sets up opportunities for narratives. Everybody else roleplays their own medieval fantasy character. Typically, the players all come together as a group of heroes who find a wrong that needs righting. As the players roleplay their characters, they make choices and they make a story. And the players often take the story in unpredictable directions.

D&D is enjoying a moment in the limelight. The game hasn't changed in all these years, but thanks to Stranger Things, a series of celebrities playing D&D, and the pandemic where we were desperate for ways to connect, people got interested. I think D&D is a great opportunity for youth at Transfig. First, it's a way to get together in person in a way that's fun, enjoyable, and something we look forward to coming to church to play. When we come together, we talk, create, play, and build community. That's a win.

But there's more than just that. Each character the players create has its own backstory, goals, view of the world that is different than the player themselves. Just like learning a foreign language helps you learn English better, roleplaying a different character can help you learn more about yourself, by emphasizing the differences. I'm still working on adding ethical problems like the trolley problem. Don't get me wrong, there's still a lot of sword fighting and magic, but the story introduces challenges that that brings real risks to the characters. That's an emotional hook that's fun in D&D.

When I run the game as the DM, I work hard to make sure everyone is included, and everyone has a chance to play their part of the story. I keep guardrails in place regarding choices players make to keep it fun for everyone.

That's why we play D&D at church, even if the whole concept seems weird. If you have any questions about it, I'm happy to answer them. Right now we're playing with youths from 6th grade to 12th grade. I'd like to cap each session at 6-8 players so everyone can be involved in the story, but if more come, we'll figure something out!

We play the 3rd Sunday of each month

from 12:30-2:30. If you want to play, email/text me so I can prepare for you. No D&D experience is necessary; we can walk you through the rules while we play. What's most important is to be willing to roleplay a character and respond to what happens in this imaginary world we're all creating together.
